	Question	Response
1.	Question 1: MDE does not allow glove bags without a variance and if allowed must still be performed inside a negative pressure enclosure.	
2.	Question 2: Tectum is usually the roof deck of a building. It is a porous wood fiber system with a cement binder. If spray on asbestos containing fire-proofing is present on the Tectum panels, it cannot be decontaminated or fully removed as between the strands of wood fibers there are holes which prohibit complete decontamination. If it is sprayed on the panels must be removed in their entirety in order to achieve complete removal of the asbestos. Alternative the panels may be encapsulated to prevent exposure of any residual asbestos which may be present within the wood fiber structure of the Tectum panels. This can be performed by gross removal and applying a latex encapsulant/paint to seal the panels. Please identify the means and method of how PGPCS would like this work performed and abated.	The means and methods procedures will be provided on a per project basis.
3.	Question 3: Boiler, CLIN 5, there are many kinds of boilers, each having different compositions of asbestos and subsequently different costs to abate. For example, there are brick boilers, sectional metal boilers, and boilers that have metal on the outside and only have asbestos on the gaskets. Can you identify what the entire boiler is made of and where the asbestos is within said boiler for pricing purposes. Removing asbestos from the outside of the boiler is vastly different than disassembling the boiler to remove all of the refractory brick made of asbestos on the inside and under some boilers in the base.	PGCPS has sectional metal boilers that have bick base. There is asbestos on the inside and outsie of the boilers.
