#### Introduction

Instead of the school functioning under multiple teams, there will only be one. The Adelphi Academic Alliance or Triple A is a group of passionate educators who inspire change among staff to create a positive culture of collaboration. This team currently consists of 20 members, which include,

The Alliance utilized days over the summer in order to plan for the 2022-2023 Pre-Service Week and to identify the instructional focus for the school year. During this time, the team will also engage in several book studies (Schools That Learn, Creating Cultures of Thinking, Improvement Science\\*\\*),\\*\\* to analyze a variety of school-wide data, as well as participate in numerous virtual team-building activities.

The Alliance will begin to assess, act, and adjust our school-wide initiative. The team will present a rough draft to the staff during Pre-Service Week. The members of the team will continue to capture our journey through a variety of evidence (photos, agendas, plus/deltas, protocols, data (benchmarks, software data reports, MCAP), etc.)

Members of the team will be responsible for creating the professional development and collaborative learning sessions agendas, as well as team building activities for the year. The members will also be responsible for communicating the work of the team back to the entire Adelphi Staff during monthly leadership and/or staff meetings and establishing a sense of community through our collective responsibility for ensuring that every student at Adelphi receives high quality instruction every day.

Adelphi Elementary School will collaborate/partner with parents to help review and revise the School Level Parent and Family Engagement and School Parent Compact. At the end of the school year 2021-2022, as well as at the beginning of the 22-23 year, parents were given a survey regarding how Adelphi could help their child be more successful at school. Based on the data provided, the

Parent Compact and Plan was developed. This information was disseminated during our Back-To-School Events and on our School's Class Dojo Page. This information is also placed on our school's webpage. Events that were recommended by parents during our Spring 2022 meeting as well as any feedback from Back to School Night were captured in our Title I Parent Plan. Parent input was captured verbally during Back to School Night. All SANE documentation will be collected and housed in the school's Title I Evidence Binder.

Each year Adelphi hosts two back to school nights; one for primary students and one for intermediate students. During both nights information is given to parents on requirements for attendance as well as the district's grading policy. In addition, during this time parents also participate in brief discussions regarding student performance on state assessments, school-wide initiatives, overall school performance, the schools climate survey, Title I budget and resources as well as other school policies. During Back to School Night parents are able to learn how school funds, including Title I resource are used to support our instructional programs.

\*\*Specialists Night (Sep - Oct 22)\*\*

Adelphi will host two Specialists nights for both primary and intermediate students. During these nights, information is given to parents on requirements for attendance as well as the district's grading policy. In addition, during this time parents also participate in brief discussions regarding student performance and they are assessed virtually and/or when students physically return to school. During these parent sessions, parents are able to see the alignment between Title I funds/resources and our academic areas of need.

\*\*Monthly Parent Meetings (Merienda) - (Nov-June 23)\*\*

Our monthly Merienda meetings are used as a forum centering on the classroom and on educational issues. These meetings frequently have a core group of parents attending while others participate as they can. These meetings are of course open to all. The meetings are also used as an opportunity to "educate" the parents about multiage practices, student learning, and education in general. In addition, stakeholders learn about the various community resources available, information regarding school budget/funding of programs as well as

other vital information that is pertinent to school operations. During the April meeting, parents will have the opportunity to share their thoughts regarding how our budget should be spent for the upcoming school year and parent suggestions are shared during Leadership Team meetings and any ideas are included in upcoming plans as applicable. An interpreter is available to translate for parents at each of these events and All SANE documentation will be collected and housed in the school's Title I Evidence Binder.

With the funds mentioned above, Adelphi Elementary School is able to purchase not only classroom teachers that allow the student-teacher ratio to stay below 30, but creates a means to purchase needed outside resources such as an additional Reading Specialist and Counselor. It also provides funds to purchase a paraprofessional for every grade level. The additional funds support our push to be a one-to-one school with technology and allows us to purchase items such as Podcasts, Elmos and other technological devices to enhance instruction. By having multiple financial resources, Adelphi can provide free Extended Learning Opportunities for the students and families of our school. For Example, Weekly English and Technology Classes to increase English and Technology literacy. Finally the funds cut down on the cost of out of pocket expenses for teachers and now the school can purchase needed supplies such as chart paper, expo markers, electric pencil sharpeners, etc for each staff member.

**Additional Community Partners** 

\*\*Brighter Bites-\*\* \*\*(Sep - June 23)\*\*

This is a nonprofit that delivers fresh fruits and vegetables directly into families' hands, while teaching them how to use and choose a different kind of fast food. This year we have partnered with this community organization to bring the Adelphi community fresh produce from local food banks in an effort to promote and create a culture of health.

\*\*University of Maryland- (Sept-June 23)\*\*

This partnership provides academic support for our students in the areas of Reading, Math, and Science. College students will mentor targeted students in order to enhance their foundational skills in all core content areas. In addition, we also will hold Partners in Print sessions monthly with the University of Maryland to expand our students and parents literacy skills
