During pre-service week, staff were presented with a detailed review of the schools current status and possible next steps for school improvement. Surveys were sent to staff to inquire about their interest in supporting different components of the schools' structure as well as an opportunity to identify areas they felt were of specific concern. A survey was also shared with families to gather information about their expectations and what they felt needed to be addressed. Parents and community partners were invited to principal meet and greet and a series of open office zoom sessions to discuss the school's performance. A school community wide stakeholders meeting was held to provide all stakeholders with an overview of the school's current state and the plan. The sessions provided participants an opportunity to ask questions and discuss next steps.

  - Blending Resources to Impact Achievement

The school is currently receiving funding from SBB, and Title I. The funds will be used to support Extended Learning Programs for students in grades K-5. We will facilitate programs in the Fall, Spring, and Summer. We will use the programs to support learning loss suffered during the pandemic. Each program will run about four weeks and reinforce skills in math and reading.

Additionally, funds will be used to support professional development, parent workshops, and parent engagement. The purchasing of instructional positions as a means to build teacher capacity, increase student

achievement, and are intended to increase the proficiency rate of the students on state assessments. Additional support from community partners help supplement where additional assistance is needed to the staff, students, and Carmody Hills Family.

Carmody Hills Elementary has created and maintained several partnerships with the agencies below. Each agency supports our instructional efforts individually and collaboratively.
