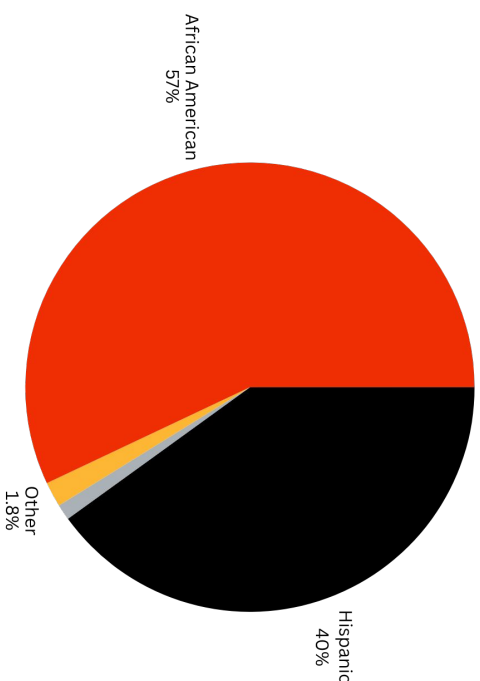
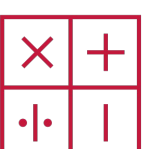

## What did we learn?



### Student Feedback

- Students value the supportive environment and friendly teachers.
- They want more engaging, real-world learning tied to future careers.
- Many need additional help in reading, writing, and especially math.
- Students are asking for better access to mental health support.
- Some feel they lack opportunities to share feedback or help make decisions.
- There is strong interest in more extracurricular activities and school events.

### Family Feedback



- Desire for more consistent communication with staff
- Requests for expanded mental health and emotional support
- Need for clearer info about health services (vision, dental, etc.)
- Interest in more events to engage families
- Concerns about college and career preparation



### Community Feedback

- Support for increasing partnerships with local services (health, housing, food)
- Interest in programs to reduce neighborhood violence
- Desire for resources to address food insecurity and internet access gaps
- Need for more community events to build trust



### Staff Feedback

- Gaps in identifying and supporting mental health needs
- Low confidence in tools for monitoring student well-being
- Need for expanded interventions for attendance and behavior
- Emphasis on creating a more inclusive, culturally responsive school climate
- Interest in stronger connections between academics and real-life applications
