




What did we learn?



Relationships: Large percentage of students feel supported by the student support services team.

Safety: Majority of students say they feel safe and enjoy coming to school.

Enrichment: Students enjoy the after-school activities that are being provided. Say they support their academics and social emotional learning.



Culture: Staff comments on the amount of activities that are focused to highlight different cultures within school.

Inclusion: High satisfaction on behalf of staff on how school community is welcoming to everyone.

Communication: High satisfaction with open lines of communication that school displays.

Participation: Majority of parents feel that they have opportunities and chances to support decision making.

Approachability: Parents feel that they can often reach out to the school and receive support or have their questions be answered due to open door policy.



Mission: All partner's feel that they are supporting the school's mission and vision.

Communication: High satisfaction from partners with communication between partners staff, and families. ,

Well-being: Community members feel shared responsibility for student development and overall family well-being.

Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities



- Increase the amount of opportunities students have to participate in field trips, diversify assemblies, careers exploration, and school-wide competitions.
- Extend and diversify the amount of opportunities after school for student enrichment.

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice



- Implementation of additional parent groups outside of the Parent Teacher Student Association meetings in which they are able to meet quarterly and speak in depth
- Provide and create leadership opportunities for students to encourage civic engagement within school community.

Integrated Systems of Support



- Increase families awareness of resources within school community - physical and mental health wellness.
- Enhance behavioral and mental health experiences within school.

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care



- Extension and implementation of curriculum and lessons to reflect the diverse student body.
- Fostering culturally responsive and inclusive learning experiences through which all students feel valued.

Powerful Student and Family Engagement



- Increase the amount of parent volunteers in order to integrate and receive support from parents for day-to-day activities, after school programs, and events.
- Increase parent and teacher engagement to foster student's academic success.
