

What did we learn?



Student Feedback Summary

- Academic Support: 25% Always receive extra help / 42% Sometimes receive extra
- Trusted Adults: 63% feel comfortable talking to an adult at the school
- Inclusion: 25% feel an overall sense of inclusion
- Behavioral Support Access: 46% Always accessible
- Healthcare Services Access Doctor/General Health: 32% Always accessible / 29% Sometimes accessible
- Hearing, Vision & Dental: 26% Always accessible, 30% sometimes accessible, 35% Don't know - * Low awareness of health services*
- Cultural Relevance in Education- 26% Always see their culture reflected, 36% Sometimes see their culture reflected, 30% Always feel their learning is connected to real life

Staff Feedback Summary

- Systems to support struggling students: 93% say there are solid systems for identifying academic struggles. 79% say the same for identifying behavioral struggles.
- Whole-School Supports: 48% report strong school-wide academic supports. 72% say there is a whole-school attendance program.
- Identification Process: 72% say there's a process to identify mental health struggles. 82% are aware of the process for identifying attendance issues.
- Staff Collaboration & Support: 57% say that they always feel comfortable talking to other adults at VVES
- Real-World Learning Opportunities: 52% report that they sometimes see real-world connections in classroom learning & field trips/expanded programs.



Family Feedback Summary

- **Community & Environment:** 71% say the school is welcoming & inclusive. Strong academic & behavioral support (e.g., PBIS). Community is mostly clear (65-70% "always" understanding)
- **Communication Preferences:** Families prefer direct contact (in-person, calls, texts) Mental Health Supports: Staff more aware than families.

Programs & Inclusion:

- 40% of families unsure about programs (after school, trips, leadership)
 Only 22% always see culture reflected in school.
 Families want more info & involvement- but don't know how to start.
 40% of families unsure if students voices are included in decisions.



Community Feedback Summary

- VVES CS Steering Committee Meets Monthly to discuss implementation & support.
- Advance Behavioral Health offers individual, group & play therapy for students/families.
