Inspire a Love for Reading with BookNook Tutoring




Free virtual reading tutoring is available to students in kindergarten through fifth grade in partnership with BookNook! There is still time to register for session 2 or session 3 tutoring!

January 25: Virtual Learning Day



Wednesday, Jan. 25 is the second of three half-day virtual instructional days for this school year. All students will attend school virtually from home Jan. 25 and then again on Mar. 31.

Virtual instruction days will provide teachers with additional time for end-of-quarter grading and planning, while maximizing learning opportunities for students.

The PGCPS <u>virtual day instruction plan</u> was approved in September by the Maryland State Department of Education for extended days of inclement weather as well as teacher professional days this school year.


The Specialty Programs application deadline has been extended through Tuesday, Jan. 17 for the <u>Academy of Health Sciences Teacher Preparation Program</u>.
