
When World Read Aloud Day and the first day of Black History Month collide, an African American Read-In is the perfect way to honor history and a reminder to share black stories!



Excellence in Education Foundation Scholarships

The Excellence in Education Foundation <u>will award</u> \$125,000 in scholarships to 34 deserving graduating seniors in various categories.

MGM Local Development Council Scholarship Program

Additionally, the Prince George's County Local Development Council will award \$200,000 in scholarships to 40 graduating seniors who best personify an ongoing commitment to "having a positive impact on others." For the <u>MGM scholarship</u>, seniors must attend an eligible high school within the vicinity of the MGM complex: Crossland, Friendly, Oxon Hill and Potomac students may apply.

The deadline to apply for all scholarships is Friday, Mar. 17.



The Safe Schools Maryland tip line is an anonymous reporting tool free to all Maryland public, private, and nonpublic schools, and is accessible for all Maryland residents by phone 1-833-MD-B-SAFE (1833-632-7233), online at safeschoolsmd.org, and by downloading the free app via the Apple App Store or Google Play Store.

Designated school officials are immediately notified about a tip concerning students, teachers and/or activities at, near or related to their school, allowing officials to respond accordingly and prevent an unsafe act from occurring.
