
BookNook Reading Tutoring Has Started

The Excellence in Education Foundation <u>will award</u> \$125,000 in scholarships to 34 deserving graduating seniors in various categories.

MGM Local Development Council Scholarship Program

Additionally, the Prince George's County Local Development Council will award \$200,000 in scholarships to 40 graduating seniors who best personify an ongoing commitment to "having a positive impact on others." For the <u>MGM scholarship</u>, seniors must attend an eligible high school within the vicinity of the MGM complex: Crossland, Friendly, Oxon Hill and Potomac students may apply.

The deadline to apply for all scholarships is Friday, March 17.

Board of Education Seeks Applicants for Ethics Advisory Panel



The Board of Education is looking for members of the community with experience in reviewing ethical matters or providing advice on administrative and legal matters to serve on its five-member Ethics Advisory Panel.

Panel members are appointed by the Board Chair with Board approval to a three-year term. The Panel will be responsible for interpreting the ethics policy (Board Policy 0107), advising the Board concerning its application and addressing alleged violation complaints.

Panel members may not be:

- Incumbent members of the Board of Education or employees of Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS)
- Elected officials
- Candidates for elective office or employed by businesses working with PGCPS

All applicants are subject to fingerprinting and a criminal background check before final approval.

Individuals interested in serving on the Panel must submit a letter of interest along with a resumé or other documentation to support the application by 5 p.m. on April 15.
