

## CEO's Boundary Initiative Recommendations Approved by Board of Education



On Nov. 10, the Board of Education approved Chief Executive Officer Dr. Monica Goldson's final recommendations for the Comprehensive School Boundary Initiative after weeks of community input.

The consultant team's preliminary recommendations were released in late September. Dr. Goldson's major changes include:

- Delaying the consolidation of Concord and Pointer Ridge elementary schools until fall 2024, placing the schools on the same timetable as Rose Valley Elementary;
- Allowing rising fifth and eighth grade students who would be impacted by boundary changes to remain at their current school for the final year. Transportation must be provided by parents. Siblings will be permitted to remain at the current school for that year only;
- Eliminating boundary changes at 29 schools that would have impacted fewer than 20 students at each school.

## **Top Board of Education News**

Highlights from the Thursday, Nov. 10 meeting of the Board of Education include:

<u>Approval</u> of Phase II of Blueprint Schools to build five new middle schools and a K-8 academy totaling more than 8,000 seats. <u>View updates</u> on schools presently under construction.

<u>Approval</u> of the CEO's School Boundary Initiative and aligning of sixth grade with middle schools.

#### **Public Hearings: All-Elected Board**

There will be three public hearings to receive community input on House Bill (HB) 0355: Prince George's County Board of Education - Workgroup, Alterations, and Orientation Requirement PG 503-22.

The bill establishes the workgroup to study and make recommendations on implementation of an electoral process for an all-elected Board, appropriate compensation and an appropriate phase-in period for changes to Board composition.
