Employee COVID-19 Testing Update



Due to the Presidents' Day holiday on Monday, February 21 and Parent-Teacher Conference Day on Tuesday, February 22 (schools closed for students and 3-hour early dismissal for 10- and 11-month employees), the COVID-19 testing and screening schedule will proceed as follows:

Central Office Staff

Unvaccinated central office staff can test at the five hubs on Tuesday, February 22:

Capital Diagnostics at H.B. Owens Science Center, 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. **CIAN Diagnostics** at Bonnie Johns Educational Media Center, Sasscer Administration Building and Louis Wilson Sr. Facilities Administration Building, 6 a.m. - 8 p.m.; Green Valley Administrative Offices, 6 a.m. - 6 p.m. **HCD International** will test at the bus lots on Wednesday, February 23.

School-Based Staff

Capital Diagnostics will not be able to reschedule testing in the schools due to limited staff. Staff should come to H.B. Owens Science Center, Tuesday, February 22 through Friday, February 25, 8 a.m. - 4 p.m.

CIAN Diagnostics

Wednesday, February 23 – testing at schools normally scheduled for Tuesdays (random student testing, unvaccinated staff testing and student-athlete testing) Thursday, February 24 – regularly scheduled testing (random student testing, student-athlete testing and unvaccinated staff testing)




Nominate a Star Custodian!

Taking Applications for the Christa McAuliffe Award

REMINDER: Pedagogy Performance Assessment for Conditional Certificate Holders

Effective July 1, 2022, all teacher candidates who are required to present Maryland certification assessments for initial licensing will be required to submit the Pearson Teacher Performance Assessment (edTPA) or the Praxis Performance Assessment for Teachers (PPAT).


