

Diversity Series: 'Men Make a Difference'



Portfolio-Based Certification Assessment (edTPA/PPAT): Implementation Update

Requirements for conditional educators to submit a portfolio-based assessment of teaching ability (edTPA or PPAT) to qualify for professional certification in Maryland have been updated.

Effective immediately, the implementation timeline for submission of the portfolio-based assessment of teaching ability (edTPA or PPAT) has been changed to **July 1, 2025**.

Prior to July 1, 2025: All conditional certificate holders who are required to present a Maryland pedagogical certification assessment may present the edTPA, PPAT, or the Praxis Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT) to meet the certification requirement.

No passing score is required for the edTPA and PPAT, however, it must be nationally scored. If submitting the Praxis PLT, the established passing score must be submitted.

Those certification areas that do not require a Maryland pedagogical certification assessment are not required to submit a pedagogical assessment. Those areas are American Sign Language, Art, Blind/Visually Impaired, Dance, English to

Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), Environmental Education, Health, Music, Physical Education, Special Education, and PTE/CTE.

Effective July 1, 2025: All teacher candidates who are required to present Maryland certification assessments will be required to submit the established passing score for the edTPA or PPAT. Passing scores will be established in 2024.

PGCPS certificate holders should have received an email from the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) announcing the **New Educator Certification System Coming Soon!** On April 29, MSDE launched The Educator Application and Certification Hub (TEACH). You are now able to utilize this new educator certification system to access your certificate and a variety of other online services. TEACH replaces the previous certification portal, which closed on April 20.
