Take Advantage of the Public Service Loan Forgiveness Waiver by October 31

Federal student loan borrowers can get credit for payments that previously didn't qualify for Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) or Temporary Expanded Public Service Loan Forgiveness (TEPSLF) until Oct. 31. Under the limited PSLF waiver, you can get credit for past payments even if you:

- · had or have a Federal Family Education Program (FFEL) loan or Perkins loan
- · didn't make the payment on time,
- · didn't pay the full amount due, or
- · weren't on the right repayment plan.
