2022-23 School Year Kicks Off Monday




For Review: Employee Code of Conduct

Helping Families Get Back-to-School Ready



"We are All ESOL Teachers:" Templeton Elementary Shines as Safe Space for Newcomers



- · Canvas is now the primary learning management system used in PGCPS.
- More than 3,000 PGCPS classrooms have new SMART MX interactive panels.
- SchoolMessenger is the official district-approved tool for communicating with families. Training is required to gain an account.
- All students have devices for learning and various digital tools are accessible for everyone. Be sure to balance instruction with online and offline tasks to maintain digital wellness for students.

2022-23 COVID-19 Safety Protocols



Top things to know:

- Masks are <u>required</u> until further notice.
- There is no longer a quarantine requirement for individuals who may have been exposed to COVID-19. Individuals who may have been exposed can remain in schools unless they become symptomatic. (It is recommended that anyone exposed get tested on the 5th day after exposure.)
- PGCPS will provide rapid antigen COVID tests only for symptomatic individuals with signed parental consent forms on file.
- Individuals who test positive should remain home for five days and can return on day six if asymptomatic.
- PGCPS has updated guidance for social distancing to mirror that of CDC.
 Individuals are encouraged to keep distance from others when feasible.
