Benefits Open Enrollment



Open Enrollment is the once-a-year opportunity to review your benefits and make selections that work best for you and your family. Changes made during Open Enrollment will be effective beginning January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024.

Open enrollment for 2024 benefits will be held from October 9-25.

- PGCPS Benefits Enrollment Decision Guide: Includes information to help you make the most of your benefit options


Consider your past, current and future healthcare needs. By understanding your options, you can ensure you select benefit plans that best fit your needs.

Enroll by October 25

During the Open Enrollment period (October 9-25, 2023), log on to Employee Self Service to review your options and select your benefits coverage. If you don't enroll, your current benefits will remain the same in 2024. There's only one exception: if you participate in the Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs), you must re-enroll each year.
