2021 PGCPS INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM CAMP IB SUMMER BRIDGE

THE IB MISSION:

The aim of all IB programmes is to <u>develop internationally minded people</u> who, recognizing their common <u>humanity</u> and shared guardianship of the planet, help to <u>create a better and more peaceful world</u>.

PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM:

The purpose of the IB Summer Bridge Program is to provide learning experiences and opportunities for students that expands their collective knowledge of what it means to be an IB student through exploration of the IB learner profile traits, approaches to learning skills, research, and writing beyond the classroom. Students engaged in virtual sessions led by IB coordinators, teachers, and support staff centered around the concept of empowering students to appreciate and celebrate their own identities as global citizens. The student sessions and schedule, as seen here, provided relevant and engaging experiences that would serve to adequately prepare them for where they are on the IB journey given various grade level expectations.

PROGRAM LANDSCAPE:

Students in the IB Programme have multiple entry points. They can enter as Pre-Diploma students in grades 9 or 10 and then continue into the Diploma program as a rising 11th grade student. Given this, students across grade levels are allowed to participate in the Summer Bridge to support them with having success no matter when they began the IB journey. For the 2021 Summer Bridge, the enrollment numbers are below:

ACCESS TO THE IB SUMMER BRIDGE PROGRAM:

The summer bridge program is promoted in the district's summer programs offering bulletin, on the PGCPS IB website, individual IB high school's websites, and information is also sent via email to currently enrolled IB students by the individual IB high school coordinators. All students from grade 9-12 currently enrolled in the IB program are able

to register for the summer bridge program. Once students are registered, IB Coordinators begin to communicate with students and parents regarding the program logistics, expectations, and benefits. Coordinators then create a school based summer program google site for parents and students to access the zoom links, session material, and communicate additional information regarding the IB program. The google site information is then shared via email with summer bridge registered students and parents in order for them to access all pertinent information.

STUDENT TESTIMONIALS:

Below are testimonials from students who participated in the IB Summer Bridge. Students ranged from rising 9th grade students to rising 12th grade students.

- "I learned how to become a little more interactive online when it came to talking to new teachers or just being in a session with people I didn't know. I was also brave enough to participate in the "Active" activity where we had to record a 30 second video of us exercising and then post it on Flipgrid, which I was hesitant to do at first. - "I liked how positive and uplifting the teachers and administrators were. I'm glad I joined and had a great time talking with them as we got to know one another." O.A., Grade 10
- "I liked that the IB program gave me so much insight into college readiness, how to succeed in the IB program, and how to maintain a healthy and balanced lifestyle in my academic career. My favorite session was taking informed action

with Mr. De Jan as it taught me how to analyze different media and subjects more efficiently and Mr. De Jan is a very fun teacher, which added to the lesson. My favorite activity was brainstorming ideas on what project I could make about a subject related to data and how this could benefit the world with Dr. Nying in the session Data is everywhere. I think bringing more students outside of Maryland who are enrolled in the IB program would give us a more vast sense of how big the IB program truly is." -N.S, Grade 10

- "The most important thing I learned from camp IB was to be a balanced person and not just a balanced student. To be balanced means that every aspect of your life is equal. As an IB student, it is important to make sure you are on top of your school work, any sport you play, any club you partake in, or a job you might have. The following data represents the student participants' perspective of the summer bridge program:


What was your overall satisfaction level with Camp IB?


