MINOR Offenses	MODERATE Offenses	MAJOR Offenses

<p>Phase Three Inappropriate behavior still continues.</p> <p><i>Response:</i> Student completes a reflection sheet and confers with teacher.</p>	<p>Phase Three Inappropriate behavior still continues.</p> <p><i>Response:</i> Parent conference is requested. Complete a PS74 and submit to office for Administrative action.</p>
