

Bullying is a term that many young kids and teenagers are familiar with as many have experienced some form of it, but school districts across the country, including Prince George's County Public Schools, are working to create safer and more inclusive learning environments for students. The county celebrated Unity Day on October 19, 2022. Staff and students at Gwynn Park Middle School (GPMS) wore orange in honor of Bullying Prevention Month and participated in a variety of activities that addressed ways to bring awareness to bullying as well as ways to prevent it from causing serious problems for kids and teenagers. Professional counselors also visited classrooms to share information about bullying. Ms. Crowder, one of the professional school counselors at GPMS stated that bullying usually occurs when someone wants to exert power over another, usually due to personal insecurities. She said she encourages students not to internalize how they are treated by a bully but to understand that the act of bullying reflects more on the bully than it does on the person being bullied. Crowder added, "If someone is dealing with a bully, stand up to the bully, do your best to appear confident inform trusted adult." and a

American Voters
Cast Their Votes

As Gwynn Park Middle School students cast and celebrated the wins of their elected Student Government Association representatives, American voters were preparing to do the same. On November 8, 2022, schools closed in the DC area as voters filled voting sites to cast their votes for political leaders. Wes Moore, a democrat, won the governor's race for Maryland becoming the first black governor in Maryland's history. Moore's running mate also made history as the nation's first South Asian woman to be elected state lieutenant governor. Miller, who emigrated from India as a child, recently tweeted, "Ever since I came to this country, I've never stopped being excited for the promise of America. I want to make sure that promise is available to everyone." Overall, 50 democrats and 49 republicans were elected to the Senate and 208 democrats and 218 republicans were elected to the House Representatives.
